Thank you again to our supporters and please considering returning your membership dues using the yellow envelope. Hope to see you all at the next program May 22nd.



From the Archives

The archives have been buzzing with activity...

The San Marino Garden Club President, Connie Knott has spent hours, actually days, in the archives inventorying and organizing the club's huge collection at the Historical Society. The club was founded in 1935 and the women of the Garden Club contributed significantly to the beauty of the city by working with William Hertrich and Armin Thurnher to support education and beautification of gardens and landscaping in both private homes and public spaces.

We also had the privilege of assisting the city with the San Marino Women's History project just in time to acknowledge some very special women who made great contributions to our city during Women's History Month. Women who were featured this year were Rary Simmons, Suzy Crowell, Barbara Maxwell, Noly Wei, Jean Wang, and Midge Sherwood. We look forward to adding to this list each year.

The San Marino City Club has temporarily stored their Centennial Leadership Project in the archives while the old San Marino Woman's Club building is under construction. This collection of framed photographs of the presidents from each of the city's organizations was a gift to the city for the Centennial celebration in 2013. Thank you to Tom Santley and Bill Payne for their ongoing commitment to the project. We have inventoried and recorded each item and the documentation will stay with the archives after these framed photos move back to their home at the San Marino Community Center is completed.

Sylvia Uriarte has been diligently maintaining and updating the **obituary project** which began years ago by volunteer **Judy Newell**. We have volumes of obituaries on file, alphabetized and inventoried. Thank you Sylvia for keeping this project alive. In addition to the obit project, Sylvia maintains the San Marino Tribune paper archive collection.

Katie Manning has been leading the **Father's Night** productions preservation project. This was a school fundraiser fathers performed on a not-so-annual basis during the 1940's-1980's. If anyone has any photos or documents regarding Father's Night, we would love to add them to the archives.

Thank you to **Aaron Gil** who has accepted to lead the **History** of the San Marino Woman's Club wall display project. Aaron has been accumulating photos and historical content about the building itself and the people involved. The Woman's Club archives are held at the Historical Society, stored in archival boxes and inventoried making the research quite easy if you have the time to view this large collection.

Next year is the 75th anniversary of the **Kathy Fiscus** tragedy. We have been receiving interest from people outside of the city looking to learn more about this sad event which received worldwide attention. A gentleman whose father was on the rescue team spent a great deal of time going through our Kathy Fiscus material researching for a presentation he plans on giving next year.

Marian the Librarian

On April 26, 1968, in coordination with National Library Week, the San Marino Public Library held its annual Open House with a crowd nearing 400 in attendance. It was a character from the 1957 hit Broadway musical "The Music Man", Marian the Librarian, who would be taking center stage at this year's



celebration. The open house promised much excitement with folk singers to play for the children and a chance to visit with plenty of San Marino authors. The main attraction though was the appearance of composer Meredith Willson who would be arriving to present the California Librarian of the Year award o w n t o our children's librarian, Beverly Saunders.

Willson was best known for his 1957 hit Broadway musical, "The Music Man" and creator of its heroine, Marion the Librarian. On this day, Saunders would be receiving the award for the first real life "Marian the Librarian"




Beverly Saunders came to San Marino in 1952 and was the first children's librarian hired for the new library opening up 1890 Huntington Drive. During her time as the children's librarian, she was instrumental in founding the Junior Friends, an adjunct to Friends of the Library

made up of elementary and junior high students. Saunders was known for offering her support to local authors and always kept these authors works available for the young readers. She was also a consultant to the three elementary schools and their PTAs as libraries were developed at the schools.

In addition to her 1968 "Marian the Librarian" award, Saunders was a recipient of the Honorary Service Award from Valentine in 1955 and the Continuing Service Award from the San Marino PTA Council in 1980. She was the first woman honored as a Paul Harris Fellow by the





San Marino Rotary Club in 1979. It was in 1984 that Saunders was recognized and celebrated for her 32 years of service with a "A Tea at the Library" retirement party hosted by the Friends of the San Marino Public Library.

The following year, with a donation made by the Burdette Purdum Debutante Guild of the San Marino


Woman's Club, new stained glass windows were installed in the bay where countless children sat attentively delighted by

Saunder's story times. The windows feature characters from Saunder's favorite children's books author, Beatrix Potter. Peter Rabbit and his mouse friend are each shown holding a book. "From the Burdettes" the name given to the young women of the guild, is inscribed on Peter's book, "To Our Friend Beverly Saunders" is inscribed on the mouse's book. When that library was to be taken down to build the library we have today, those windows were removed and again, with the support of the



Woman's Club, were preserved, framed and hung in the Crowell Library so they could continue to honor and remember this beloved librarian.


